Recap & Context

Jesus, on the night of His betrayal, comforts His disciples in the Upper Room. With betrayal and denial in the air, He begins with a word of peace: "Let not your hearts be troubled." Jesus acknowledges the fear in the room and offers trust, not in circumstances—but in Himself.

- Betrayal vs. Denial: Judas is released; Peter is restored
- Jesus is preparing a place for His bride (John 14:2-3)
- The Jewish betrothal process reflects our covenant with Christ
